SOME STATES CONSIDERING ABORTION BANS — PRO-LIFE LEADERS URGE CAUTION

As state legislatures go back into sessions across the nation, hundreds of pro-life bills covering topics such as abortion, euthanasia, and stem cell research will come up for debate. Some states are considering measures to ban abortions, but pro-life groups urge caution because they will still be overturned in court. Lawmakers in at least five states, including Georgia, Indiana, Ohio, South Dakota, and Tennessee, have proposed legislation to prohibit all or most abortions. State Republican Representative Roger Hunt says he thinks it is time to test the court. But even with the addition of Samuel Alito to the U. S. Supreme Court, there are ONLY four conservative justices, and we need FIVE to overturn *Roe v. Wade*, which

is needed before these laws can be upheld.

Clarke Forsythe, a leading attorney at Americans For Life, said, "I think that it is better policy in January 2006 to be passing legislation that can be enforced and that can protect women and minors from the physical and psychological risks of abortion." He said states should look to passing laws like parental notification, informed consent requirements, or other measures designed to reduce abortions. Should states approve wholesale abortion bans, he worries they will be overturned by the courts and further entrench *Roe v. Wade* as a legal precedent.

I completely agree with Clarke Forsythe. What can be upheld with the four Supreme Court judges with votes from one or more is the legislation he mentioned. It requires patience as we work for the point when we know we have five judges able to put in place all that is necessary to overturn *Roe v. Wade*. When that happens, the aforementioned states may be among the first to ban it in their states, which will help take the lead for other states to do likewise. When cooking up a plan to make abortion illegal, treat it like a soufflé. If you open the door to the oven too soon, it will flop. Let us all work patiently to the point where we can and will ban abortion.

PRESIDENT BUSH TOUTS DECLINE, CALLS FOR HUMAN CLONING BAN

During his State of the Union speech in January, President Bush touted the significant decline in abortions and called on members of Congress to pass a comprehensive ban on all forms of human cloning. "There are fewer abortions in America than at any point in the last three decades," President Bush said. "These gains are evidence of a quiet transformation — a revolution of conscience, in which a rising generation is finding that a life of personal responsibility is a life of fulfillment," the President explained. Meanwhile, President Bush told Congress that advances in medical research should "not cut ethical corners" and "recognize the matchless value of every life." "Tonight I ask you to pass legislation to prohibit the most egregious abuses of medical research — human cloning in all its forms," the President said. He called on Congress to approve legislation that would prohibit "creating or implanting embryos for experiments," "creating human-animal hybrids," and "buying, discarded, devalue, or put up for sale," Bush said.

PLANNED PARENTHOOD – THE ENEMY OF THE PEOPLE

These are pretty strong words, but from the conception of Planned Parenthood under Margaret Sanger, the mission of this organization was that of eliminating people they believed did “not qualify” to live. They even supported genocide and eugenics. Modern Planned Parenthood is the largest abortion provider in the United States, and Planned Parenthood supports Partial Birth Abortion, opposes parental involvement, and women being given alternatives to abortion. They do all this with our tax money under Title X, which is supposed to be used for birth control but is used for other unwanted taxpayer-funded activities.

For this reason, the following is information on this organization. The saying “know your enemy” is very important and thus enables us to take action to remove the enemy and the activities it is involved in that destroys innocent human life.

Planned Parenthood is responsible for 8% of all the estimated abortions performed in the United States since the 1973 Supreme Court rulings *Roe v. Wade*. Records were established in the 1980s, and through the years the numbers have increased. In 2004, the percentage increased to 19.8%. The percentage has been increasing every year. The number of babies that Planned Parenthood has killed is 3,803, 806.

1. Currently, Planned Parenthood kills over one-quarter million babies each year in its own facilities.
2. Planned Parenthood does 180 abortions for every one adoption referral.

3. Planned Parenthood kills 14 babies for every one it helps with prenatal care.

The number of Planned Parenthood affiliates in the country is 119. The number of facilities that do chemical and medical abortions (RU-486 abortions) is 57. The number of clinics that do chemical, medical and surgical abortions is 172. More clinics are providing RU-486 abortions and have stopped doing surgical abortions.

Three states account for 30% of all these clinics: California, New York, and Texas. In New Mexico, there is one surgical center in Albuquerque. Since Governor Richardson changed the policy to allow RU-486 abortion, this clinic does those as well. There are other clinics that do not provide abortions but do provide referrals. The number of health clinics has declined, as well as those who do abortions. In 1993, at the peak of having established clinics, there were 929 clinics. Today there are 66 fewer clinics, with more reductions anticipated due to cuts in funding from both states and federal funding. In Amarillo and the Texas Panhandle, there was a 37% cut. Two clinics in Pharr, Texas and Marion, Ohio were closed for the loss of taxpayer money. A backlash across the country is taking place, and taxpayers are objecting to the use of their money for Planned Parenthood. There has been much effort through anti-Planned Parenthood coalitions and much success in stopping new clinics from opening. Some new clinics are being planned for opening in Juneau, Alaska and Bozeman, Montana. However, Planned Parenthood is having to raise its own money to establish these clinics.

Planned Parenthood began advocating sex education in schools. They became very aggressive in the 1970s and 1980s. In correlation, sexual activities and teen pregnancy increased. In the 1990s, abstinence programs were established, and the result has been a great decline in teen sexual activity and teen pregnancy. Planned Parenthood has actively worked against abstinence programs declaring that they do not work.

President Bush made a policy that says federal money going for sex education in the schools must also have abstinence programs in place where other sex education programs are being presented. Planned Parenthood in New Mexico tried to get the state to refuse the money so that abstinence programs could be removed. It is through the sex education program that Planned Parenthood recruits its future customers.

What do they teach in their programs? Here is a sample. This was taken from the Planned Parenthood website for teens under the concept of Healthy Sexuality. Go to <http://www.com/education/activity-013.php>. Planned Parenthood lists what it considers are teenager's rights to:

1. Learn about their bodies;
2. Decide whether or not they want to be sexual – alone or with another person;
3. Say no to unwanted sexual activities and say yes to desired sexual activities;
4. Learn about their sexual health – including information about birth control, sexually transmitted infections, safer sex and sexual pleasure; and
5. Express their sexuality without fear of pregnancy, infections, prejudice or violence.

Who else is being targeted by Planned Parenthood?

With Cecile Richards, daughter of former Texas governor Ann Richards, as their new president, they are aggressively targeting Latinos and African Americans and are

trying to establish new clinics. They have established school-based clinics or work with those established by others, to help Latinos and African Americans become customers of Planned Parenthood. This customer service would include contraceptives, morning after pills, which can work as a contraceptive or as an abortifacient depending on when it is taken, and providing abortions.

The new clinics they want to establish are "express" clinics that are smaller centers that act like a pharmacy to dispense Plan B (Morning After pill) and birth control drugs.

Working with the ACLU, they are targeting hospitals that do not provide abortions. When there are mergers or purchases of a secular hospital that previously provided abortions, the Catholic hospitals revoke the secular hospital's policies. These hospitals are the ones being targeted to force them to provide abortions.

The recent battles on placing two nominees to the Supreme Court also got the involvement of Planned Parenthood, who opposed both men. I wonder what money they used for advertising, etc.?

Meanwhile, Planned Parenthood is in trouble with the courts, and many clinics have lawsuits against them. In Ramsey County, Minnesota, District Judge David Higgs has ruled Planned Parenthood of Minnesota violated state law when it performed an abortion on a 17-year-old girl in 2002 without notifying her parents. He rejected PP's argument that the state law definition of an emancipated minor who does not need parental consent for an abortion includes girls who have previously borne a child.

In San Francisco, there is an investigation into the organization's handling of sexual abuse cases. On Planned Parenthood's Golden Gate website, a client shared her story. "I was raped at 11 by my 17-year old boyfriend. I chose not to tell my parents, because I didn't think their involvement would help. That was the right choice for me. Planned Parenthood helped me deal with the aftermath of the rape allowing me to deal and cope as best as I could in my own way."

By law, Planned Parenthood is required to report to authorities cases of child abuse. The investigation is being done to see what other cases may exist and whether to prosecute.

Planned Parenthood has lost money from boycotts over the past 13 years at an estimated amount of \$35 million. Many corporate leaders are becoming aware of Planned Parenthood's true agenda and activities and are no longer supporting the organization. However, there are still some major companies that do give financial support. They are Adobe Systems, Bank of America, Johnson & Johnson, Kenneth Cole, Levi Strauss, Nationwide Insurance, Principal, Prudential, Unilever, Washovia, Whole Foods, and Walt Disney.

Please note that the American Girl doll company is giving funds to Girls, Inc., an organization that openly supports abortion.

We must keep alert and be prepared to keep Planned Parenthood from doing harm to unborn babies, our children, and our society.

ROE V. WADE – TRUTH AND MYTH

The average American is very unclear about what Roe v. Wade says. Polls indicate that they want abortion very restricted but at the same time do not want Roe v. Wade overturned. If it is not overturned, you have difficulty in restricting it. So let's look at the "facts" that have been provided to the American people. Please learn them and share them with others. We must get the truth out.

MYTH: "High Court rules abortions legal the first three months."

FACT: In Roe v. Wade, the Supreme Court ruled that abortion may not be restricted at all in the first trimester; in the second trimester abortion may be regulated for the mother's health. After "viability," abortion may be prohibited except where necessary to preserve the mother's health.

Roe's companion case, Doe v. Bolton, defined maternal "health" as "all factors – physical, emotional, psychological, familial, and the woman's age – relevant to the well-being of the patient." Thus, abortion is legal – and cannot be prohibited – in the 7th, 8th or 9th months of pregnancy if any of these reasons are invoked.

No significant legal barriers of any kind exist today in the United States for a woman to obtain an abortion for any reason during any stage of pregnancy.

MYTH: Most abortions are done because of maternal or fetal health problems or in cases of rape or incest.

FACT: Abortions are rarely done for these reasons. According to the Alan Guttmacher Institute survey, women cite these as the main reason for an abortion in a very small percentage of cases each year.

1% - "rape or incest"

3% - "woman has health problem" (physical or mental)

3% - "fetus has possible health problem"

For all other abortions, the main reason cited is:

21% - "unready for responsibility"

21% - "can't afford baby now"

16% - "concerned about how having a baby could change her life"

12% - "has problems with relationship or wants to avoid single parenthood"

11% - "is not mature enough or is too young to have a child"

8% - "has all the children she wanted or has all grown-up children"

1% - "husband or partner wants woman to have abortion"

1% - "doesn't want others to know she had sex or is pregnant"

<0.5% - "woman's parents want her to have abortion"

3% - "other"

Under Roe v. Wade, abortions for these reasons or any other must be legally permitted.

MYTH: Most Americans favor U. S. abortion law.

FACT: Most Americans actually oppose it. A 2005 Harris Interactive poll claims 52% of Americans favor Roe v. Wade and 47% oppose it. But the poll describes Roe as "the U.S. Supreme Court decision

making abortions up to three months of pregnancy legal." That's wrong. The fact is Roe made abortion legal through all nine months of pregnancy. In the same poll, 72% of Americans said abortion should be illegal in the second three months of pregnancy, and 86% said abortion should be illegal in the last three months of pregnancy.

Even support for abortion in the first three months is open to question. In a 2004 Zogby International poll, 61% of Americans said abortion should not be permitted after the fetal heart-beat has begun. This occurs in the first month. So why do 52% of Americans say they favor Roe v. Wade? Because they don't really know what Roe did.

MYTH: Roe said the Constitution includes a right to abortion.

FACT: Even legal commentators who support legal abortion have said Roe is not good constitutional law.

Roe v. Wade is "a very bad decision...because it is not constitutional law and gives almost no sense of obligation to try to be." - John Hart Ely, Yale Law School Professor

"Since its inception, Roe has had a deep legitimacy problem stemming from its weakness as a legal opinion." - Benjamin Wittes, *Washington Post* legal affairs editorial writer

"One of the most curious things about Roe is that behind its own verbal smokescreen the substantive judgment on which it rests is nowhere to be found." - Laurence Tribe, Harvard Law School professor (abortion supporter)

MYTH: Supreme Court Justices have criticized Roe v. Wade.

FACT: "I find nothing in the language or the history of the Constitution to support the Court's judgment." - Justice Byron White

"This Court's abortion decisions have already worked a major distortion in the Court's constitutional jurisprudence...no legal rule or doctrine is safe from ad hoc nullification by this Court...in a case involving state regulation of abortion." - Justice Sandra Day O'Connor

Roe v. Wade "destroyed the compromises of the past {and} rendered compromise impossible for the future...{T}o portray Roe as the statesman-like 'settlement' of a divisive issue...is nothing less than Orsellian." - Justice Antonin Scalia

Roe v. Wade "was grievously wrong." - Justice Clarence Thomas

"Roe v. Wade...ventured too far in the change it ordered and presented an incomplete justification for its action." - Justice Ruth Bader Ginsburg

MYTH: The U. S. abortion rate is relatively low.

FACT: It is among the highest of all developed countries in the world. In 1973, the Supreme Court in Roe v. Wade deemed "every {abortion} law - even the most liberal - as unconstitutional." Today the U.S.

has the highest abortion rate in the western world and the third highest of all developed nations worldwide. There are 1.31 million induced abortions induced annually in the U.S. or 3,500 every day; 24.5 % of all abortions end in pregnancy.

MYTH: Most American women support Roe v. Wade.

FACT: Most do not. Roe v. Wade legalized abortion throughout pregnancy for virtually any reason. Yet according to a national survey of women published by the Center for Gender Equality, "only 30% think abortion should be generally available." In fact, most women say abortion should be substantially limited or never permitted.

1. 17% said abortion should never be permitted.

2. 34% said abortion should be permitted only in cases of rape, incest, and to save the woman's life.

And when asked to rank 12 issues in order of importance for the women's movement, women ranked "Keeping abortion legal" next to last.

MYTH: Most abortions are done before fetal organs are functioning.

FACT: Actually, the vast majority are done after the fetal heart has begun beating. A fetal heart begins to beat at about 21 or 22 days after fertilization. That's at about three weeks of development. 77% of abortions in the United States are done well after this point.

MYTH: U.S. abortions have not encouraged the use of abortion as a method of birth control.

FACT: Nearly half of all abortions are performed on women who have already had at least one. Today, 48% of women having an abortion in the U.S. have had at least one previous abortion. In some states the rate of repeat abortions is much higher. In Maryland, for example, 71.4 of those having an abortion have already had at least one. And 16.4% have had at least three prior abortions.

MYTH: Abortion is legal only when the fetus is in the womb.

FACT: Even a child who is partially born can be legally aborted. Partial-birth abortion kills a fetus during the process of delivery. At first, abortion providers said it was rare and used only on women whose lives were in dangers or whose fetuses were damaged. But Ron Fitzsimmons, the Executive Director of the National Coalition of Abortion Providers, admitted he had "lied through my teeth." He admitted that most partial-birth abortions are not done for "extreme circumstances" but are "primarily done on healthy women and healthy fetuses." In 2000, the Supreme Court said states cannot ban partial-birth abortion even with the exception to save the mother's life. The Court said such a ban violates "the woman's right to choose" established by Roe v. Wade.

Note: Congress has passed a law banning partial-birth abortion, and the President signed the law. Federal courts have put injunctions on

the law, so it has not been enforced. However, the U.S. Supreme Court has been asked to review the constitutionality of the law. We should hear on this soon.

MYTH: If Roe v. Wade is overturned, abortion will automatically be illegal in the U.S.

FACT: If Roe is overturned, abortion policy will be decided through the democratic process in each state. Before Roe v. Wade, all states permitted abortion if necessary to save the mother's life, and some permitted abortion in additional circumstances. But Roe deemed "every {abortion} law – even the most liberal – as unconstitutional." As a result, no state can prohibit any abortion at any time during pregnancy. If Roe is overturned, policy decisions about abortion will be made by the citizens of each state through the democratic process rather than by the courts. Some states will place limits on abortion; in others there will likely be few limits. Not until Roe v. Wade is reversed will the people again be able to govern themselves on the important policy issue of abortion.

MYTH: Roe v. Wade is only about a woman's right to abortion, not about a right to take life in general.

FACT: Roe has often been cited by state and federal judges to endanger human beings already born. In 1986, relying on Roe, the Supreme Court invalidated a law intended to ensure care for children born *alive* during attempted abortions. In 1983, a U.S. district court invalidated a federal regulation to prevent medical neglect of handicapped newborns in hospitals receiving federal funds. The court said the regulation may "infringe upon the interests outlined in cases such as...Roe v. Wade." In 1980, a New York court cited Roe in a "right to die" case arguing that the "claim to personhood of a terminally ill comatose patient...is certainly no greater than that of the fetus." In 1993, a Michigan judge cited Roe in dismissing criminal charges against Jack Kevorkian and declaring that the state law against assisted suicide was unconstitutional. And in 1996 the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Ninth Circuit relied heavily on Roe and its successor, *Planned Parenthood v. Casey*, in finding a constitutional "right" to assisted suicide. While some of these rulings were later modified or reversed, they all underscore how Roe v. Wade has been used to argue that ideas of privacy and liberty can trump life itself – after as well as before birth.

MYTH: Abortion is standard medical practice; only religious hospitals and some physicians refuse to provide it.

FACT: Even abortion advocates acknowledge that abortion is outside mainstream medicine. The vast majority (86%) of all U. S. hospitals, whether religious or secular, public or private, do not participate in abortions. 71% of abortions in the U.S. are performed in free-standing, abortion-dedicated clinics. Only 5% are performed in hospitals,

2% in physicians' offices, and 22% in other kinds of clinics. A *New York Times* article reports, "The overwhelming majority of abortions are performed by a small group of doctors (some two-percent of OB-GYNs carry the burden performing more than 25 per month)." The medical community's stigmatization of abortion is acknowledged by Physicians for Reproductive Choice and Health, which says one of its "primary strategic goals is to eradicate the stigma that has become attached to abortion and abortion providers within mainstream healthcare."

MYTH: Roe v. Wade empowers women to choose freely whether abortion is their best option.

FACT: Legalized abortion has made it easy for others to pressure women into having abortions. Not freedom but "lack of control over one's life" is associated with high abortion rates, as is "lack of financial and social reasons." An on-line survey of women who had abortions showed that many women feel pressured by the baby's father; 85% of fathers offered no encouragement to continue the pregnancy. When women said they wanted to continue the pregnancy, the fathers' dominant reactions were: "Slightly Upset 60%, Mad 38%, Very Angry 43%," compared to "Happy 0.7%" 73% of fathers suggested an abortion. 80% of the women surveyed experienced guilt, 83% regret, 79% loss, 62% anger, and 70% depression. Even a website that encourages women to consider abortion "so they can *freely* decide if it is their choice" elsewhere posts personal stories describing pressure, coercion, or abandonment by the baby's father.

NOTE: Cardinal William H. Keeler, in a January 6, 2005 letter to all U.S. Senators, noted the following points – each of which was documented throughout this series.

1. "For over three decades, Roe has sparked more informed criticism and public resistance than any other decision of the late 20th century."

2. "Even legal scholars who support abortion have criticized Roe for not being grounded in the U.S. Constitution."

3. "Further, in 2000 the Supreme Court relied on Roe to rule that the gruesome and inhumane practice of partial-birth abortion must be constitutionally protected."

Or, in the words of a former law clerk to Justice Blackmun, the Roe Opinion's author, Roe is a poor choice for a "litmus test" for judicial nominees, for "as a matter of constitutional interpretation, even most liberal jurists – if you administer truth serum – will tell you it is basically indefensible." "By any measure," said Cardinal Keeler, "support for the Supreme Court's 1973 Roe v. Wade decision is an impoverished standard for assessing judicial ability."

**“ABORTION IS
ALWAYS WRONG”**

This thought provoking article is from Brian Rohrbough, father of a slain Columbine student Danny Rohrbough. He will be giving the address at the 2006 March For Life sponsored by Colorado RTL.

Brian understands the killings at Columbine are linked with the teaching of several generations that taking the lives of pre-born babies through abortion is acceptable.

“When we allow mothers to murder their children, we undermine the foundation of life. If our society teaches children that we will not value or protect the life of an innocent baby, then our children will realize there are no boundaries.

When schools like Columbine deny that life is granted by our Creator as our Declaration of Independence

states, and then teach as a religion the theory of evolution, students now believe that survival of the fittest is their right. Further, when schools teach that there is no absolute right or wrong, students can decide for themselves if they want to murder their classmates.”

Note: “Brian Rohrbough is a hero for his courage in stating what our elected officials should be saying,” notes Leslie Hanks, Vice-President of Colorado Right To Life. “The incredible pain and loss in his life has taught him that all life is sacred and worthy of legal protection. He knows Colorado began the abortion holocaust, which has led to the unjust taking of nearly 50 million innocent live and deaths of nearly 60 students in related school shootings in the U.S.”

Post note: Colorado was the first state to legalize abortion in 1969.
