THE RIGHT TO LIFE COMMITTEE - POLITICAL ACTION COMMITTEE MAKES ITS ENDORSEMENTS FOR THE JUNE 3, 2008 PRIMARY

In this edition of Viva Life, you have the results of the endorsement process that has been made for those Senate and House districts that have contests for the Primary election in June. Our endorsements are based on an expanded agenda. It is no longer sufficient to be anti-abortion; you must be pro-life. This encompasses the opposition to embryonic stem cell research, cloning, and rationing healthcare or finding food and water as medical treatment. You must also work in all areas at the legislature that you have a voice in to pass pro-life bills or oppose anti-life bills.

These endorsements or recommendations only hold through the Primary. Those candidates without opposition for the Primary will be questioned later, and a new round of endorsements will be made in August.

There are some cases where whoever wins in the Primary will be your new legislator; they have no opposition in the general election. Some of these are incumbents and some are new.

Pro-Life incumbents with perfect voting records are endorsed, even though those running against them may be pro-life. Those not endorsed under these circumstances have an APL after their name. However, all candidates had to answer the questionnaire to be endorsed, even if they are incumbents with perfect pro-life voting records.

The following is an explanation of the coding used on our endorsements sheet.

Endorsement - Candidate agrees fully with RTLCSNM's positions.

Recommended - Candidate agrees with most of RTLCSNM's positions.

APL - Candidate answered the questionnaire and is pro-life.

A - Candidate answered the questionnaire.

NA - Candidate did not answer the questionnaire.

NA-PLR - No answer from the candidate despite several contacts but does have a pro-life voting record.

RA-PLR - Candidate was contacted but despite having a pro-life voting record refused to answer the questionnaire.

"SOLUTIONS" THAT CREATE PROBLEMS

The following are cases where "solutions" created more problems and, in some cases, problems worse than the one for which the solution was created.

Problem 1

It was a news article about a high school in Arizona that was giving special gift bags to seniors for their prom night that got me to think about this subject. In the gift bags were a variety of items, such as a picture frame, candy, etc. Also included was a condom. The message that came with this but not in written words was, "You are going to be sexually active on Prom night, so use the condom and prevent a pregnancy."

What a put down and what a cop out from teaching correct behavior in the home and the school. What a lie. It is known that condoms do not prevent pregnancies, especially when used by someone who is high on drugs or alcohol and/or in the throes of passion.

Even if it did prevent a pregnancy, it does not prevent sexually transmitted diseases that can sterilize a person, do great physical harm, and, yes, can kill them. Yet the message is they are "safe". Again, instead of addressing the action with abstinence encouragement, we provide "safety" and encourage the very thing we don't want: sexual activity by our youth.

Problem 2

The U.S is giving support to Planned Parenthood (PP) with taxpayer money. Planned Parenthood is the largest organization offering sex education and the largest abortion provider. Recently, something that has been going on for some time throughout our nation came to the media's attention. In 2004 in Cincinnati, Ohio, Planned Parenthood was sued. They gave an abortion to a 14 year-old girl without her parent's knowledge, which is required by law in Ohio. The person who paid for the abortion using his ID was a 21 year-old man, a soccer coach who was the father of the unborn child and who started having relations with the mother when she was 13. The girl's ID showed she was a minor. Evidence showed statutory rape took place. This was not reported to the police. The family has sued Planned Parenthood for negligence. The case has now reached the Ohio Supreme Court. It will rule on whether the family can have access to the clinic's medical records for women under 18. Meanwhile, the young girl is suffering from Post Abortion Syndrome.

This same clinic has been sued in another case. In November 2004, the father of a 16 year-old girl forced her to have an abortion. The girl told an employee of the Planned Parenthood facility that her father was forcing her to have sex. This sexual abuse and incest was never reported to the police. The father continued to rape the girl for another year and a half.

Taxpayers are financially supporting an organization that has no regard for women, children, or their families. Our taxes are supporting an organization that is breaking the law and causing great havoc. They are the problem, and they do not offer a solution.

Problem 3

Healthcare solutions are being sought to satisfy the many American people who want cures, relief, and financial support for their health; what they want is national healthcare. This care is neither free nor is it often healthcare. They can and will, in many cases, depending on age and circumstances, be denied healthcare. You pay taxes, and you may pay with your life.

The citizens of England and Canada, to name a few of the nations who offer "free" healthcare, found that they could not afford to care for all, so they started to limit the resources available to some people. This is called rationing. As the cost increases and money is needed to repair crumbling structures and to try to increase research, the money available for patients will be based on quality of life decisions. Other decisions will reduce the cost.

In England, pregnant women are now urged to use midwives to deliver their babies. They don't have enough room for all of the hospital deliveries. Money spent on prematurely born babies is very limited. In Britain they have expanded the role of their pharmacists to prescribe any medicine (except controlled drugs like morphine and codeine) for any condition the pharmacist is qualified to treat. Other treatments, such as checking blood pressure and others with chronic problems, can be done by the pharmacist after having 30 hours of experience treating patients under a doctor's supervision.

The head of the American Academy of Family Physicians is greatly concerned that "the availability of medicines may be a bad thing if you're not careful." He also worries that the British system, which offers free healthcare to all, might make it too easy for pharmacists to make mistakes. "The whole idea of determining what medication a patient needs is the ability to diagnose a medical condition," he said. "That's where all the years of medical and residency training come in." But as Britain's cash-strapped national healthcare service tries to treat the crush of patients with chronic problems like heart disease and diabetes, making more use of health workers other than doctors may be essential. What it is is discounted medical care, as pharmacists and nurses make less money than doctors, which is a big savings to the British government. Money there and in Canada dictates who gets what, where, when, and by whom. Is this a solution or a problem? In the USA, there is healthcare available for the poor and low income through clinics, etc. Health insurance is available by joining united business groups and some government employees' groups. You will be treated by a doctor, and you won't have to wait six months or over a year to be seen.

Meanwhile, the United States under its government program Medicare is having its problems. Medicare is expected to go broke by 2017. There have been massive amounts of money misspent and more and more people using it, which will increase as our population ages. There will be cutbacks and changes. The question is who will be affected by this and under what circumstances? The problem can be solved without reducing good healthcare or rationing what health care is available.

Conclusion

These are only a few examples showing solutions by government entities spending our money that can create problems greater than the problem itself. It can ultimately be the cost of a life or a continued abuse of human lives. This must stop!

WHY VIABLE CHAPTERS ARE NEEDED

RESPECTED EUROPEAN ONCOLOGIST OPPOSES EUTHANASIA AFTER CANCER BATTLE

Madrid, Spain

A respected European oncologist has changed her mind about euthanasia after battling cancer. Because of Sylvie Menard's change of heart, she is now a leading anti-euthanasia activist to urge people not to abandoned the elderly and disabled patients who need love and support as they battle medical problems,

Dr. Menard, one of the most renowned oncologists in Europe, has been battling bone cancer, and she shared her transformation on end-of-life issues with the Spanish magazine *Huellas*.

"Those who promote euthanasia do so for two reasons: They don't want to suffer, and they don't want to lose self-sufficiency, thus becoming a burden for others," Menard explained.

"Even if you do not have complete use of your faculties, and you cannot get up because you are confined to bed but you still have the affection of your family members, in my opinion, even in those conditions, it's worth it to keep living," she told the magazine.

She said ill patients "do not want to experience pain" and that "they have a right to alleviate it" but emphasized that

"pain therapy has advanced considerably in recent years."

Alex Schadenberg, head of the Euthanasia Prevention Coalition, said he is encouraged by the news and said he hoped Dr. Menard's conversion would help promote the dignity of people whose quality of life society disregards.

"Dignity is related to how we interact and care for others," he said. "People who feel abandoned in their time of need will often feel that they are a burden on others or that their life has become hopeless. The antidote to the culture of death is a culture that cares for and supports the most vulnerable in their time of need," Schadenberg added.

"The culture that we live in needs a radical shift towards a commitment by society and individuals to care for people and not kill people," he concluded.

WHAT'S NEW?

Changes in our society are on a fast track. Researchers at the University of Minnesota have grown a beating heart in a jar. They used detergents to strip a rat heart of its own cells, leaving behind a white, three-dimensional scaffolding of connective tissue. They then infused it with living cardiac cells from newborn rats, which multiplied and grew into a fully functional heart - a first in the field of tissue engineering.

"We figured out how to use nature's own matrix - chambers, valves, blood vessels," said Dr. Doris Taylor, the lead researcher and Director of the university's Center for Cardiovascular Repair. She said that the technique holds promise for growing human tissue to repair not only hearts but many other parts of the body. "It might be possible," she said, "to grow whole organs for patients who need a transplant."

Other tissue engineering scientists around the country said there are enormous obstacles to using the technique for people but described the work as exciting and a landmark.

The Research was published online by *Nature Medicine*, a journal known for publishing cutting edge science.

EMBRYONIC STEM CELL RESEARCH ALTERNATIVE JUMPS AHEAD WITH PARKINSON'S SUCCESS

When two research teams last year created embryonic-like stem cells that could be ethical alternatives to embryonic stem cell research, pro-life advocates were hopeful about their potential. Now scientists at the Whitehead Institute for Biomedical Research have used the reprogrammed cells to successfully treat Parkinson's in mice.

In November Japanese professor Shinya Yamanaka and American researcher James Thomson released studies in the medical journals *Science* and *Cell* about their process known as direct reprogramming. They were able to make adult stem cells revert to their embryonic form by turning human skin cells (fibroblasts) into pluripotent stem cells sharing essentially all the features of human embryonic stem cells.

Since then, scientists have been able to advance the knowledge and use of the cells, as the Boston area researchers unveiled the latest success story Monday, April 8, 2008. The Whitehead scientists released a new study showing the Induced Pluripotent Stem Cells (iPSC) were effective in alleviating the symptoms of Parkinson's in rats.

Weeks after a transplant of the iPSCs, Parkinson's

symptoms were significantly reduced, and the cells were able to replace lost or damaged neurons. Marius Wernig and his team published the new study in the Proceedings of the National Academy of Sciences. Wernig told Thomson Financial News, "This is the first demonstration that reprogrammed cells can integrate into the neural system or positively affect neurodegenerative disease. We have shown that the reprogrammed cells have the potential to be used therapeutically, but we still need to find better and safer ways to generate the cells," he added.

The news excited noted bioethics scholar Wesley J. Smith, who said the results show iPSCs have already jumped well ahead of cloning methods in trying to help reduce the effects of diseases. "In essence, this was therapeutic cloning without the cloning, since the (rat) cells were subject specific and tailor made from the cells of the animal," he said. "In one swoop, iPSCs rushed past therapeutic cloning, since scientists haven't even been able yet to derive human cloned embryos and extract stem cells from them," Smith added.

The direct reprogramming technique involves the introduction of four genes into the skin cells, thereby "reprogramming" them to a less specialized (pluripotent) state. The newly-produced embryonic stem cells are known as "IPS" cells. The good news about the process is that it can be replicated easily and that could mean labs across the world could produce embryonic-like stem cells without destroying human life.

Last month, UCLA researchers advanced the technique and were able to replicate the studies and create the skin cells without destroying human embryos. Kathrine Plath, an assistant professor of biological chemistry at UCLA and lead author of the study, told the Daily Breeze that the stem cells they created "were virtually indistinguishable from human embryonic stem cells."

Pro-life groups have welcomed the findings because they represent another alternative to destroying human life to advance science.

ABORTION LEADERS ADMIT THAT PRO-LIFE ARGUMENTS ARE CONVINCING

Two of the nation's most influential pro-abortion leaders have admitted publicly that the pro-life movement has convincing arguments that pro-abortion forces have no response to. In an opinion piece published by the Los Angeles Times on January 22, 2007, Frances Kissling and Kate Michelman wrote that the phrase "culture of life" coined by Pope John Paul II has had a significant impact.

"To some people, pro-choice values seem to have been unaffected by the desire to save the whales and the trees, to respect animal life, and to end the violence at all levels," they write.

"Pope John Paul II got that and coined the term 'culture of life'. President Bush adopted it, and the slogan, as much as it pains us to admit it, moved some hearts and minds. Supporting abortion is tough to fit into this package."

The authors also admit that the pro-life movement's focus on the unborn child and its attempts to limit access to abortion have worked both politically and socially. They lament that "Twenty years ago, being pro-life was déclassé. Now it is a respectable point of view."

Significantly, they acknowledge that the strategy of showing people photos of the gruesome reality of abortion is working, despite the fact that it has been a matter of controversy among some pro-lifers. "In recent years, the anti-abortion movement successfully put the nitty-gritty details of abortion procedures on public display, increasing the belief that abortion is serious business and that some societal involvement is appropriate. Those who are pro-choice have not convinced America that we support a public discussion of the moral dimensions of abortion," the authors write.

Such frank admissions of the power of pro-life arguments are significant, coming from two of the most important figures in the pro-abortion movement. Kate Michelman was the president of the National Abortion Right Action League (NARAL), the original and most influential pro-abortion organization in the United States, with the possible exception of Planned Parenthood. Frances Kissling was for many years the leader of "Catholics for a Free Choice," an organization repudiated by the Catholic Church, that promotes abortion, sodomy, and fornication, and fights to eliminate the Vatican's observer status at the United Nations.

PASTORS ACCUSE PLANNED PARENTHOOD OF "GENOCIDE" ON BLACKS

Washington – The Planned Parenthood Federation of America has perpetuated a "genocide on the Black community," says a group of African-American pastors who claimed Thursday the birth control and abortion provider has had a racist agenda since its beginnings in 1921.

Holding a brief vigil and press conference in front of a Planned Parenthood clinic in Washington D.C., the group of pastors and activists said they were incensed by the results of recent "undercover" inquiries into several Planned Parenthood clinics across the country.

"Every day...over 1,500 Black babies are murdered inside the Black woman's womb," said Reverend Jess Lee Peterson of the Brotherhood Organization of a New Destiny (Bond). "This is a race issue."

The pastors urge Congress to initiate an audit of the organization and have written letters demanding that money for Planned Parenthood be eliminated from federal Title X funding, of which the group got \$65 million for fiscal year 2007, according to pro-life Concerned Women of America. In total, Planned Parenthood has received \$300 million in government contracts and grants in the current fiscal year.

The national office of Planned Parenthood provided FOX News with a lengthy statement on Thursday, April 24, in which it said its role in the African-American community is widespread because the need is greater. "The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention revealed that a shocking number of teenage African-American girls – nearly half – carry a sexually transmitted infection," reads the statement. "This compares to an overall average rate for all teenage girls of at least one in four."

"The largest increases in the teen birthrate were

reported for non-Hispanic Black teens, whose overall rate rose 5% in 2006. In addition, African-American women are more likely to die of breast cancer than the general population," it said. But an investigation undertaken by students at the University of California at the Los Angeles newspaper The Advocate revealed troubling responses from Planned Parenthood staffers when asked by an actor posing as a "donor" if he could earmark his contribution for abortions for "Black babies" only.

In one example, Autumn Kersey, Vice-President for Marketing at Planned Parenthood of Idaho, is asked whether a donation can be specified "to help a minority group ...like the Black community, for example."

"Certainly," Kersey says in a taped response in which she sounds

genuinely encouraged by the offer. "If you want to designate that your gift be used to help an African-American woman in need, then we would certainly make sure the gift is earmarked for that purpose." The caller responds, "Great, because I really faced trouble with affirmative action, and I don't want my kids to be disadvantaged against Black kids. I just had a baby. I want to put it in his name." The "donor" proceeds to proclaim that "the less Black kids out there the better," followed by "understandable, understandable," by Kersey, who laughed as if he were joking. This was done at six other clinics who took the donations. That is part of a troubling trend, say critics, who accuse Planned Parenthood of targeting minority neighborhoods.

"I think the media, and I think America, and certainly Black folks, need to start thinking about race and Planned Parenthood," said Reverend Clenard Childress.
