WELCOME TO THE RIGHT TO LIFE COMMITTEE OF NEW MEXICO!

There will be many new people reading *Viva Life* for the first time this month. For this reason, we are going to review who and what we are. Whether you are new or a person who has received the newsletter for awhile or a supporter of our organization, it is good to understand our basic mission and goals.

First, a little history. The Right to Life Committee of New Mexico started in 1969 and incorporated with the State of New Mexico in 1970 as a non-profit-organization. It is a civil rights organization and is not a religious organization. The Declaration of Independence says that "All men are created equal," and that is the basis of our organization. All people from all walks of life are welcome.

This organization has its membership voting for and establishing our state board of directors and chapters with their boards of directors. Donations to this "mother" organization are not tax-deductible. This organization expanded later to include the RTL-CNM Educational Trust Fund, which is tax-deductible for those who give donations. However, it does not have membership or political activities. It does provide educational materials, programs, and this newsletter. The RTLCNM Political Action Committee was formed to find and support bi-partisan pro-life candidates at the state level (National RTL endorses federal candidates). The donations used to help get these candidates elected are not tax-deductible.

The subjects we cover and oppose are Abortion, Infanticide, and Euthanasia. Under these three headings is Stem Cell Research (we oppose embryonic stem cell research but support adult stem cell research) and Assisted Suicide and rationing in health care plans.

We do not take a stand against contraceptives unless it is the type that kills a newly developed human being, such as the I.U.D. RU-486 is an abortifacient taken to kill an unborn baby five to seven weeks after fertilization and is not a birth control procedure.

We do not take a stand against capitol punishment, war, and many other issues that do concern human beings and their rights.

We limit to the subjects we have as we deal with Abortion, Infanticide, and Euthanasia.

Our organization has a state office at 2800 San Mateo Blvd NE, Suite 107, Albuquerque, NM, 87110 open 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Monday through Friday. It is run by one full-time executive director, a part-time secretary and a part-time computer worker. All other work is done strictly by volunteers.

The state organization has a state board of directors that come from counties that have been divided among nine districts. There are two directors and an alternate from every district. Membership from the districts elects their directors. Officers are the President, Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer, and National Delegate who are elected by the membership.

Chapters are developed in counties of New Mexico. Their chapter boards keep the educational activities going in their area that can be a county or a defined area. These directors are first

appointed and then at election time the membership in the area the chapter covers elects this board.

There is a delegate to National RTL who is on its board to represent New Mexico.

All these people are members of The Right to Life Committee of New Mexico. All abide by our Mission Statement and our Goals.

COMMENTARY BY THE EDITOR – DAUNEEN DOLCE

In this edition we have been explaining who and what The Right to Life Committee is and its purpose and goals. You have been introduced to the people who give of their time to work these goals at the state and chapter level.

I would like to list all the people who volunteer and give donations to our organization, but space does not allow this to happen. I will tell you about these people, though. They are your neighbors, your family, your co-workers, and your fellow citizens. They have the same busy schedules, the same concerns, and the same frustrations of today's society as you do. However, they are extending themselves by giving time, money, and faith in trying to change our world into being one that is a caring society. They want to leave to their grandchildren and those that come after us a world a little better because we cared enough to "do something".

Indeed, they have done something. Our organization is one that plants seeds for the growth of respect for human life. But once in awhile we get feedback on our efforts. This usually happens at the State Fair or from a letter or phone call.

This year, as has happened in previous years, someone came to the booth to tell us that because we had a booth and gave them information, they did not have a planned abortion and gave birth to her child - a decision she was very happy with.

POLITICAL PROFILES

In the September *Viva Life* we started profiling political candidates for the office of the presidency. Candidates are randomly picked. The first two were Barack Obama (D) and Mike

Huckabee. To read this article, go to www.rtlnm.org and look for the September newsletter. If you don't have a computer, the summary of what was said is that Barack is a strong supporter of abortion and has a long voting record to support this statement. Mike Huckabee (R), former Governor of Arkansas, has a long record to show that he is pro-life. The only issues we are addressing are the pro-life issues. The information provided has come from NARAL, an organization that supports abortion.

REPRESENTATIVE TOM TANCREDO (R-CO)

"As a devout Christian, father, and grandfather, I am a strong believer in the right to life for the unborn child. For years, activist judges have undermined life. As president, I would stop this by appointing strict constructionist judges, reining in the power of the judiciary and supporting constitutional amendments that respect life."

Rep. Tancredo's voting record is 100% pro-life. When asked if the repeal of *Roe vs. Wade* would be a good day for America, Tancredo said... "I would say that that would be the greatest day in this country's history when that in fact is overturned." He also said, "Conservatism doesn't need an adjective. It needs a leader. And it needs a leader who opposes abortion not because Iowa caucus-goers oppose abortions. It needs a leader who opposes abortion because he knows that God said, 'I knew you when you were in the womb.' Throughout my public career, I have always maintained a deeply held conviction that abortion compromises the sanctity of human life."

SENATOR MIKE GRAVEL (D-AK)

Former Senator Gravel's choice position is mixed-choice. His record with NARAL is such:

- 1980 - He was absent from all three choice related votes.
- 1979 - There were eight choice-related votes, and Sen. Gravel voted pro-choice on seven and was absent on one.
- 1978 - There were three choice votes, and Sen. Gravel voted pro-choice on all three.
- 1977 - Of the nine choice related votes, Sen. Gravel voted pro-choice six and was absent for three.

He has said, "I am opposed to today's ruling or any ruling that places restrictions on reproductive rights. Today's decision authorizes federal intervention to prohibit a nationwide procedure the American College of Obstetricians and Gynecologists has found at times to be medically necessary. Any decision on abortion should remain between a woman and her doctor; there is no room for interference from politicians and judges."

This was a statement from Sen. Gravel on the Supreme Court decision upholding the Federal Abortion Ban (Partial Birth abortion) on May 9, 2007.

REPRESENTATIVE RON PAUL (R-TX)

Rep. Ron Paul is classified by NARAL as having an anti-choice voting record. He does not have a 100% pro-life voting record. Some quotes from Rep. Paul are: "*Roe vs. Wade* was wrongly decided, but not because the Supreme Court presumed abortion rather than ban it. *Roe* was wrongly decided because abortion is simply not a constitutional issue."

"Pro-life libertarians have a vital task to perform: to persuade the many abortion supporting libertarians of the contradiction between abortion and individual liberty. A libertarian's support for abortion is not merely a minor misapplication of principle, as if one held an incorrect belief about the Austrian theory of the business cycle. The issue of abortion is fundamental, and therefore an incorrect view of the issue strikes at the very foundation of all beliefs."

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“Although the real problem lies within the hearts and minds of the people, the legal problems of protecting life stem from the ill-advised *Roe vs. Wade* ruling, a ruling that constitutionally should never have occurred.”

SENATOR JOE BIDEN (D-DE)

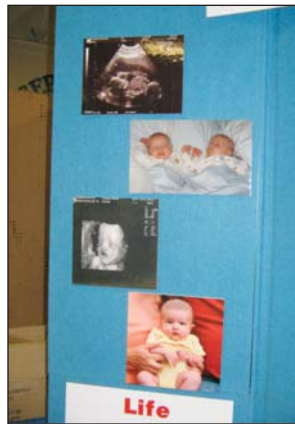
Sen. Biden does have a 100% pro-choice voting record. This is a statement he submitted to NARAL.

“I am a long-standing supporter of *Roe vs. Wade* and a woman’s right to choose. The Supreme Court’s intellectually dishonest and paternalistic opinion in *Gonzales vs. Carhart* (partial birth abortion) makes clear that the Bush appointed conservative majority is tipping the scales against *Roe*. I am concerned the decision laid the groundwork for undoing *Roe vs. Wade* and a sad consequence of Bush’s initiative to the Supreme Court. I opposed the nominations of Justices Roberts and Alito. I believe that the fundamental right of privacy should be protected, and if elected, I will nominate candidates to the Supreme Court who share my values.

“*Roe vs. Wade* protections only have real meaning if women can safely exercise their rights is why I voted for the Freedom of Access to Clinic Entrances Act and have consistently providing access to military women serving abroad. I support reasonable judicial bypass requirements in parental notification provisions. I do not agree with criminalizing adults who help young women access abortion – we need to support young girls, not isolate them. Finally, I have consistently opposed the Mexico City Policy and other ‘gag’ rules and believe that governmental entities should spend their private resources as they see fit, including providing reproductive health services.”

STATE FAIR REPORT

Once again there was a very successful RTLNCNM booth at the State Fair. The State Fair Committee with Charlene Comba as its chair created a great booth. Over 71 people volunteered to man the booth for the 17 days of the fair. They enjoyed themselves while truly making a difference. Many people learned facts they didn’t know before. And we know we saved at least one baby’s life. This makes everything very worthwhile. Special thanks go to RTLNCNM’s office secretary Geneva Trujillo who did a fantastic job of scheduling. Charlene kept the whole fair working and did a marvelous job. To the volunteers, kudos for a job well done.



To work in any of the booths at the fairs around the state doesn’t take a great deal of knowledge or time. It does require a smile, a love of life, and a commitment. Next year, try it - you’ll like it.

WHY IS STEM CELL RESEARCH SO CONTROVERSIAL?

There are different types of stem cell research. Some are acceptable by those who are pro-life and others are not acceptable at all.

The Right to Life Committee of New Mexico supports “Adult” stem cell research. Adult stem cells are almost anything but embryonic stem cells. It can be your own adult stem cells, from another adult, a child later in development, and from umbilical cords, placentas, and amniotic fluid from babies just born. It can be from baby teeth, pig’s cells, and other sources that do not require the killing of a newly formed human being at the embryonic stage.

No cells taken from an embryo that result in the death of the child has ever been used to cure or treat any disease. Not true for adult stem cells. Here is the history of stem cell research.

- 1998** - Team lead by Dr. James Thompson at the University of Wisconsin isolates embryonic stem cells for the first time. Wisconsin Alumni Research Foundation receives patents on embryonic stem cell work.
- 1999** - Researchers working with Parkinson’s disease use patient’s own adult stem cells and produce a 62% increase in dopamine uptake and a 40-50% gain in certain motor tasks.
- 2001** - President Bush announces his plan to fund research on existing embryonic stem cell lines.
- 2002** - Study concludes bone marrow (adult) stem cells are an accessible, expandable source of cells that offer a promising future for spinal cord repair. Parkinson’s patient treated with own neural (adult) stem cells had symptoms reduced by 80%.
- 2003** - Researchers inject a natural protein into the brains of Parkinson’s patients; the stimulated adult stem cells provide an average 61% improvement in motor function. Researchers find that infusing bone marrow (adult) stem cells into patients after a heart attack aid regeneration of the heart.
- 2003** - Sixteen-year-old boy shot in the heart with a nail gun causing heart attack and irreparable damage. Doctors take the teen’s own (adult) stem cells and infuse them into his heart; blood flow to the heart increases 10%.
- 2004** - Researchers perform the first ever pathology follow-up of one patient treated for Parkinson’s disease. Study shows the protein-stimulated sprouting of new neurons in the brain. Scientists treat ten Parkinson’s patients with protein to stimulate the patients’ own brain (adult) stem cells, showing significant improvement in symptoms. Doctors find patients with congestive heart failure improve greatly when treated with their own adult stem cells. Cardiologist shows that a type of human bone marrow (adult) stem cell can turn into most tissue types of the body. Islet cells can be donated for patients opening transplant possibilities using a technique of a mother donating (adult) cells for her diabetic daughter, alleviating diabetic symptoms. Scientists find patients can serve as their own donors converting their liver cells to insulin-secreting cells.
- 2006** - Transplant of nasal (adult) stem cells into seven patients with spinal cord injury: patients regain some motor function and sensation; two patients show bladder control improvement. Scientists show they can grow pancreatic cells for long periods and turn them into insulin-secreting cells. Team demonstrates human umbilical cord blood (adult) stem cells from insulin-secreting cells.

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The worst enemy of human hope is not brute facts, but men of brains who will not face them.

Why is Stem Cell Research so Controversial?...

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2007 - Young stroke victim treated with umbilical cord (adult) stem cells. Three-year-old girl with leukemia is successfully treated with infusion of her own cord blood (adult) stem cells. Scientists create brain cells from adult human (adult) stem cells; could lead to advances in treatments of Parkinson's disease. Diabetes patients are insulin free following blood (adult) stem cell treatments. Scientists grow human heart tissue from adult stem cells.

BENEFITS SEEN FROM ADULT STEM CELLS IN HUMAN PATIENTS

As seen above, there has been great help to those with Parkinson's disease, heart problems, those paralyzed, and those with leukemia. However, there are many other diseases and conditions that have benefited from adult stem cell research. They are:

1. 26 forms of cancer, including breast cancer, leukemia and brain cancer;
2. 16 auto-immune diseases, including type-1 diabetes, Crohn's disease, and multiple sclerosis;
3. Two cardiovascular problems, including chronic coronary artery disease;
4. One ocular problem;
5. Three immuno-deficiencies;
6. Three neural degenerative diseases and injuries that includes Parkinson's disease;
7. Ten anemias and other blood conditions, including sickle cell anemia;
8. Four wounds and injuries, including limb gangrene and jawbone replacement;
9. Five other metabolic disorders, including osteoporosis;
10. Two liver diseases, including cirrhosis of the liver; and
11. One bladder disease.

To date, **adult stem cell research has given us benefits in 73 conditions in human patients. Embryonic stem cell research has given us zero.**

TRUTH VERSUS FICTION: The media does not mind misleading the American citizens when it comes to the discussion on embryonic stem cells (there is no discussion on adult stem cell research). In September in the *Albuquerque Journal* there were two articles on the subject. The first article stated the success of using human embryonic stem cells to regrow the heart muscle of rats that had survived lab-induced heart attacks. They said this means some day we can hope to see relief for people who suffer heart attacks. Another article talked on the same subject but further said that adult stem cells haven't shown much progress in treating heart disease.

This is not only **absolutely incorrect**, but it does a disservice to people with damaged hearts. In England they have had such success in treating heart disease. They are using adult stem cells to create an all new heart. Adult stem cells have regenerated new heart tissue as well as treated chronic coronary artery disease. This is mainly due to the fact that the stem cells came from the adult with the problem and thus are not rejected by the person as being foreign matter.

The question as to why the whole truth is not told and adult stem cell research is ignored is probably because of the great amount of money that can be raised from embryonic stem cell research. It needs new computers and facilities, and when and if ever available, can seek great funds for the research and for the use.

Adult stem cell research or its use is expensive, but the laboratories are in place and are thriving on donations from corporations and from the federal government. The payoff is great, and the future looks to be mind boggling. Each and every day there are more reports of a new use, cure, or treatment. We should be shouting this from the house tops, not hiding it under a barrel. We don't need to use invitro-fertilized eggs, since there can never be enough as it takes so many to be used in research. Nor do we need to clone embryos so that we can have more embryonic eggs to use (remember - we are talking about a stage of our human life). If we ethically break the "barriers" to go this route, what else will we do in the name of science to "advance" mankind? We asked that question when Adolph Hitler was in power, and we need to ask that question today.

HILARY CLINTON ON HEALTH CARE

Hilary Clinton, who offered us a health care plan when her husband was president that provided for the payment of abortions and rationing health care (euthanasia), has now offered a new plan. This plan is not as clearly defined as her first plan and offers no details. However, her ideas of what health care should be and the initiatives she has offered does show what her agenda is.

She called for expanding the eligibility for the government-run Children's Health Insurance. Her plan would enable roughly five million more children to enroll. This plan called the SCHIP plan was originated to cover poor and near poor adults and children who fit that category. Now this plan will cover all children and young adults for families who earn up to \$80,000.00. The President has said he will veto this plan, as it is too expensive and will increase taxes. He would support the original plan.

This change is among many that Senator Clinton is proposing. She has said, "We need to take step-by-step progress toward providing insurance for every American. I'd expand the Children's Health Insurance Program. I would allow people between 55 and 65 to buy into Medicare. I want to see mental health considered on parity."

The health care plan she is offering that will cover every American, by her own words, will cost \$100 billion annually and will require tax increases for those making more than \$250,000. This will bring in only \$50 billion dollars. Where does the rest of the money come from?

One of the proposals accompanying the ill-fated 1994 health care proposal would have had the creation of a board that would determine who gets a life-saving operation and who does not. This is called practical eugenics.

When there is not enough money (and Medicare is already in trouble), then decisions to eliminate care, drugs, and other health needs will be given by some set of priorities. There will be no competition for health care and no recourse for those abandoned in the "practical eugenics" decisions.

Health care sounds good. A poll shows over 63% of Americans say they want free health care. Nothing is ever free. Someone has to pay for the health care as we do with Medicare today. Americans don't mind helping the poor, but to pay for all people at all income levels is neither possible nor needed.

**BRITISH DOCTORS WARN
SECOND PART OF
